



CLIMATE ADAPTATION MENU TRAINING



BACKGROUND:

The Northern Institute of Applied Climate Science (NIACS, www.forestadaptation.org) has produced several new adaptation menus to help natural resource professionals adapt to climate change. Historically, the focus at NIACS has been on forest management and silviculture, but in recent years we've expanded our toolkit to address a wider range of topics that natural resource managers consider.

OUTCOMES:

At this training, participants will:

- Get a quick recap of **regional and local climate change trends**.
- **Learn about several new adaptation menus**, covering a range of topics.
- Work on example projects to **brainstorm adaptation project ideas**.

- Watershed management
- Wildlife management
- Tribal/ indigenous perspectives
- Fire –adapted ecosystems
- Outdoor registration
- Forest carbon management
- Glacial lake fisheries
